In the recent sex trafficking case conducted last Friday by the Sheriff's Office, a new tool was utilized, K-9 Jeb the electronic detection dog. K9 DEPUTY JEB was donated by kNot Today, an Indiana-based not for profit organization that combats sex trafficking and exploitation of children by providing awareness, prevention strategies and restorative services to those involved in the abovementioned situations. https://knottoday.org/

Jeb and his handler, Captain Matt Sneed were utilized to search a vehicle and located tracking devices that had been placed (hidden) on the car for constant monitoring of the female victim's whereabouts.

Sheriff Garcia is proud

of this K-9 team and would like to thank kNot Today for Jeb's gift and training. "We take all crimes seriously; however, crimes like this committed against humans leave a deep and lasting impact," Garcia said today.

The ability of a K-9 to locate tracking devices is due to a single chemical compound (triphenylphosphine) in electronic devices of all types. Jeb is an asset that any central Indiana Law Enforcement Agency can request for mutual aid.
