

SIU Carbondale celebrates overall enrollment increase

CARBONDALE, Ill. – For the first time since 2014, enrollment at Southern Illinois University Carbondale has grown. Overall enrollment for fall 2023 is 11,359 — 252 students, or 2.3%, more than last year — the highest overall boost in the number of students in 21 years and highest percentage increase in over 30 years.

This is a moment for all Salukis to celebrate,” said Chancellor Austin A. Lane. “Over the last three years, our faculty, staff, students, alumni and donors set out to strategically increase our enrollment in a number of key areas. Today, that work has paid off, and there’s more to come as we continue to hit targets within the Imagine 2030 strategic plan. I want to personally thank everyone in

Saluki Nation for everything they did to set us on the right trajectory. Today’s exciting news proves Salukis imagine ambitious goals, and then we make them reality!”

The university is well positioned for more growth, Lane said, and it is on track to reach its goal of 15,000 students by 2030, set in Imagine 2030.

In addition, 1,621 new freshmen are starting their college careers at SIU, which is 103, or 6.8%, more than last year. This is the first time in at least 50 years the university has increased its freshman class for four consecutive years.

The university also saw a 10.8% increase in new transfer students to 1,188. Part of that success can be attributed to Saluki Step Ahead agreements signed with more than 40

community colleges in Illinois, Missouri and Texas since 2021. Saluki Step Ahead provides a seamless path for students who earn associate degrees in participating community colleges to obtain their SIU bachelor’s degrees online in select programs. About 130 students, 121% more than last year, are earning their degrees through Saluki Step Ahead.

Enrollment in online degree programs also increased by 9.2% to 2,128. On campus, the residential student population has risen 5.5%.

Also contributing to overall enrollment is an 11.8% increase in new graduate and professional students, compared to last year. International student enrollment increased 6.5% to 853 students.

In addition, the university has ramped up its effort to

recruit students from the Southern Illinois region, and those efforts have paid off, Lane said. Overall undergraduate students from the region increased by 7.2% over last year to 754. New freshmen from the region rose by 7.7%.

What to know about replacing gutters

Certain home renovation projects are more glamorous than others. A remodeled kitchen is sure to garner its share of “oohs and aahs,” while a newly paved driveway is much less likely to dazzle guests.

Signs gutters should be replaced

- Peeling paint

- Water damage: Water damage on the gutter can be limited to certain spots and will be noticeable on the underside of the gutter
- Soffit damage
- Sagging gutters
- Detached gutters, which can be detached from other pieces or the house
- Rust

Who should replace gutters?

Many home improvements can be completed successfully by skilled do-it-yourselfers, but a gutter replacement is best left to the professionals. Homeowners who live in single-story homes may be able to replace gutters on their own, but the issues that can arise when gutters are not functioning at optimal capacity make this a job best suited

to professionals, even in residences without high roofs.

Some gutters may be under a manufacturer’s warranty, so homeowners can check to see if their gutters qualify for a free upgrade. Experience is one of the best reasons to work with a professional gutter installation team. Experienced professionals can identify which gutters are the best fit based on a host of factors, including the pitch of the roof, local conditions and the size of the house. In addition, gutter installation requires the use of various tools that many DIYers may not have on hand, which can cut into the cost savings of doing the project yourself.

Homeowners also should not underestimate the challenges of working on ladders that are high up off the ground. Professionals are accustomed to such challenges, while DIYers may not be comfortable or used to climbing ladders with materials and tools in hand.

A gutter replacement is a worthwhile investment that can ensure rain water efficiently and effectively runs through gutters and away from the roof. Leaving this task to the professionals can ensure the job is done right.

3 great reasons to replace aging windows

That third layer of glass significantly reduces noise levels, making triple-glaze windows ideal for homes on busy streets or those in urban areas with lots of foot traffic. Golconda, IL: The first permanent settlement in Pope County

Situated on the Ohio River in Pope County, Golconda, Illinois is one of those quaint little towns that hold a special place in the hearts of anyone who has ever lived there. The town sits on the Ohio River and at one time had a ferry that carried passengers across the river to and from Livingston County, Kentucky.

The town of Golconda was the first permanent settlement in Pope County with an area of .54 sq miles of land and water and was named after the city of Golkonda, India. The town was first settled in 1798 and in the winter of 1838 was the site where an estimated 13,000 Cherokee Indians crossed the river by ferry on their way to Oklahoma as part of the relocation project known today as “The Trail Of Tears”.

At that time the town consisted of several stores, a bank, hotel, a hospital, several churches and a post office. The town was the perfect place for those traveling the Ohio River to stop and spend the night and for riverboats to drop off goods and livestock.

After crossing the river the Cherokees were not allowed into the towns due to a fear of disease and had to travel much farther to go around them. Some of the Cherokee settled in areas around Golconda and were ancestors of my husband. His great grandmother was Nancy New. Nancy married my husband’s great grandfather who was German and they lived in the Golconda area for many years on land given to her by the government. That land is now part of the Shawnee National Forest.

Golconda is also where Dam 51 was built in the early twentieth century and stood until after the new Smithland Lock

and Dam was finished and the US Army Corps of Engineers removed it. All that remains are the homes built along the river in the late 1920’s to house the Corps employees

who operated the dam and the main operations building. The homes have now been renovated and are available to rent for overnight lodging. If you are looking for a

quaint little town to explore come and check out the City of Golconda, Illinois. Explore the Pope County Courthouse, visit the marina or stay in a riverfront home. This is

the perfect place for a quiet getaway overlooking the Ohio River. Contact the City of Golconda for rental information.



corporation founded in 1993 by John O'Dell to promote completion of the River-to-River Trail, which now runs 157 miles through the Shawnee National Forest between Elizabethtown on the Ohio River and Grand Tower on the Mississippi River. The Society engages in trail maintenance and advocacy, and it offers free guided hikes to members and the public during the spring and fall hiking seasons.

In 2020, SIU

Carbondale launched the Saluki Commitment and Saluki Transfer Commitment to close financial gaps for students who qualify. In the last three years, SIU has joined the Common App, signed agreements with several schools and youth organizations in the Southern Illinois region and the Metro East, more strategically recruited students and increased marketing, advertising and communications.



Cognitive dissonance is typically experienced as mental and emotional stress when an individual participates in an action that goes against what they know is right. According to this theory, when two desires or ideas are not consistent with each other, people will try to justify and compromise until they become consistent enough to be accepted. This discomfort is triggered by the person’s knowledge clashing against new information when it’s introduced, wherein the individual tries to find a way to resolve the contradiction to reduce their guilt.

This might sound like a lot of psychological gobbledy goop, and you might be asking, what does all of this have to do with me and the way I live? I’m glad you asked. We all have a lot of personal and secret thoughts going on in our minds and how we deal with it goes a long way toward being a more stable, balanced, and spiritually content person. I’m not excited about it, but we are constantly exposed to negative voices and influences that we might consider, but I hope we refuse. The point is coming to the place where we are honest with God and ourselves. Many of our headaches and anxieties are self-inflicted and our temptations often come from areas where are weak and vulnerable. The devil has been watching us for a long time and there is no reason for him to stop using tactics against us that are always successful.

Take for example, we know that we should stop wasting so many hours each day playing on our phones and television, but we do it anyway. Why? Because we want to. Of course, if we really believe this is a serious problem,

we would turn them off, but instead, it’s much easier to ignore it with a compromising and enduring attitude. This is cognitive dissonance. The general idea of living on purpose is to examine every aspect of our lives and develop a desire to become the best version of ourselves we can be. Or in other words, it should be important to us that we are the person that Jesus died for us to be. The subconscious discomfort we are talking about is an internal misery that does not need to be a part of our lives. We want peace and the more we please God and follow His voice, the less we are convicted and condemned for our willful disobedience.

Apple Picking Time!!

Cool crisp temperatures are right around the corner and with that we are reminded of the sights and smells of Autumn, and at the top of the list is apples! Here are some delicious apple recipes that you'll fine very a'peel'ing!



Crescent Apple Dumplings



- Ingredients**
2 granny smith apples
2 cans crescent dough
3/4 c. (1 1/2 sticks) butter, plus more for pan
1 c. brown sugar
1 1/2 tsp. cinnamon
1 tsp. pure vanilla extract
Pinch kosher salt
8 oz. lemon-lime soda
- Directions**
Preheat oven to 350° and grease a large baking dish with butter. Peel and core apples then cut each apple into eighths.
Separate crescent dough into triangles. Starting at the

wider end, roll one apple slice up in a crescent triangle. Repeat with remaining apple slices and crescents. Place into prepared pan.
In a small saucepan over medium heat, melt butter, brown sugar, cinnamon, vanilla, and salt together. Pour mixture over apples.
Pour soda around edge of pan, trying to avoid pouring on top of dumplings. Bake dumplings until golden, 30 minutes.
Serve warm with ice cream and spoon sauce from pan over dumplings.



Mom's Fried Apples

- Ingredients**
1/2 cup butter, cubed
6 medium unpeeled tart red apples, sliced
3/4 cup sugar, divided
3/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
Vanilla ice cream, optional

- Directions**
Melt butter in a large cast-iron or other ovenproof skillet. Add apples and 1/2 cup sugar; stir to mix well. Cover and cook over low heat for 20 minutes or until apples are tender, stirring frequently.
Add cinnamon and remaining sugar. Cook and stir over medium-high heat 5-10 minutes longer. If desired, serve with ice cream.

Did You Know You Can Freeze Fried Apples?
Yes, you can freeze fried apples! After preparing the fried apples, let cool them completely, then place in an airtight, freezer-safe container for up to 3 to 6 months. To use, thaw in the refrigerator and warm in a saucepan over medium heat.



Crockpot Apple Butter

- Directions**
Add all ingredients to a bowl of a crockpot and toss to combine. Cover and cook on low for 10 to 12 hours or until apples are deeply golden and falling apart.
Using an immersion blender or regular blender, blend apples until smooth. If using a regular blender, pause to remove lid every so often to let steam escape.
Pour apple butter into jars and let cool to room temperature. Cover and store in refrigerator. It will keep for a few weeks.

Caramel Apples



- Ingredients**
1 cup butter
2 cups packed brown sugar
1 cup light corn syrup
1 can (14 ounces) sweetened condensed milk
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
8 wooden sticks
8 medium tart apples
Unsalted peanuts, chopped, optional

- Directions**
In a heavy 3-qt. saucepan, combine butter, brown sugar, corn syrup and milk; bring to a boil over medium-high heat. Cook and stir until mixture reaches 248° (firm-ball stage) on a candy thermometer, 30-40 minutes. Remove from the heat; stir in vanilla. Insert wooden sticks into apples. Dip each apple into hot caramel mixture; turn to coat. Set on waxed paper to cool. If desired, roll the bottom of the dipped apples into chopped peanuts.
